
We hope everyone has a chance to attend church to see what we're talking about and that it brightens the holidays for family and friends!

December Council Meeting Minutes

Ebenezer UCC Council Meeting Minutes

December 21, 2025

Nick Kuhn called the meeting to order at 7:30 AM

In attendance: Judy Mattes, Andy Hofmeister, Kristi Schnell, Nick Kuhn, Pastor Dave

Pastor Dave led us in the opening prayer

Kristi Schnell made a motion to approve the agenda. Judy Mattes seconded the motion, and the agenda was approved.

Pastor Dave gave the pastoral report

- Urged the council to communicate with the congregation about his role

- Pastor Dave has been settled by St. John's, but will remain Ebenezer's interim pastor until 1 of 4 things happen:
 - We find a different interim
 - Jane Anderson finds someone else to suit our church
 - We find a settled pastor
 - The council decides he should no longer serve as interim pastor

Pastor Dave also communicated that we should urge the congregation to come to the council with any thoughts or questions they may have.

He also wanted it to be known that families of confirmants can be reimbursed for fees

Kristi Schnell made a motion to approve last month's minutes. Judy Mattes seconded the motion, and the minutes for November were approved.

The treasurer's report for November was reviewed by the council.

Expenses: (\$22,071.92)

Checking Account Balance: \$111,242.29

Money Market Account: \$105,562.30

Total Equity: \$216,804.59

Minus Special Giving Account: \$78,511.40 \$138,293.19

Cambridge Accounts: \$77,387.26

Parsonage Income: \$1495.00

On 11/19/25, \$16,615.00 was transferred from the memorial fund into the checking account to pay for the bell tower repairs. On 11/18/25, the amount of \$238.38 was paid to Stephanie Adamietz to reimburse for the supper with Santa supplies. November's givings will be reflected in the next month minutes as they were deposited after 11/30/25.

Judy Mattes made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Kristi seconded the motion, and the Treasurer's Report was approved.

Andy Hofmeister made a motion to pay the bills for December. Kristi Schnell seconded that motion, and it was approved for the bills to be paid.

Committee Reports

Christian Ed: Christmas program performed on December 21 at the service, and no Sunday School on December 28

Evangelism: Discussion on getting shirts made with the church logo to wear at events. Supper with Santa went well

There was discussion on the Budget for 2026

- Numbers are planned for worst case scenario where we need to cover everything by ourselves

There will be another Council Meeting on December 28, 2025 at 7:30 AM to discuss the 2026 budget

Our Annual Congregational Meeting will be held January 18, 2026. There will be a short Council Meeting afterward to elect officers.

The next Council Meeting will be January 25, 2026, at 7:00 AM

Kristi Schnell made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Andy Hofmeister seconded the motion, and the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 AM.
